NCHU <u>Bachelor Program in Taiwan Humanities and Creativity</u> Graduation Requirements for Students Enrolled <u>after 2024</u>

I. Years of Enrollment:

Minimum years of enrollment: 4 years (5 years for Veterinary Medicine)

Can be extended for 2 more years (excluding 2 years of suspension)

II. Minimum graduation credits required: <u>128</u> credits III.Courses required by the university curriculum:

- 1. Physical Education: 2 credits, not included in the credits for graduation. Extra taken PE course credits will be counted as from other departments, and are limited to a maximum of 2 credits. Athletes with outstanding sports achievements will be handled according to the relevant regulations of the Office of Physical Education and Sports.
- 2. English Proficiency Requirement: 0 credit.
- 3. General Education: 28 credits
 - i. Core Competencies: at least 3 credits.
 Among them, 'Information Literacy: Programming and AI Applications' is a required course worth 1 credit.
 International students do not need to take the "Information Literacy" course.
 - ii. Language Competencies: (at least 8 credits)
 - ➤ College Chinese : 4 credits
 - ➤ Foreign Language: at least 4 credits and at most 6 credits.
 - Freshman English: 4 credits
 - Academic English Reading and Writing: 2 credits
 - iii. Domain Competencies: at least 10 credits
 - ➤ Humanistic Domain, Social Science Domain, and Natural Domain: at least one course in each Domain, total at least 6 credits.
 - > Integrated Domain: at least 4 credits.
 - ➤ For National Defense education courses, only credits of 1 course can be counted as general education credits. Taking courses beyond the prescribed limit in this category cannot be counted as credits from other departments.
 - ➤ Our program belongs to the area of <u>Culture</u>, therefore, only one course from this area will be recognized. Taking courses beyond the prescribed limit in this category cannot be counted as credits from other departments.
 - IV. Extra credits □can ■can' t be counted in the graduation credits.
 - V.Others: Courses offered by this program and Graduate Institute of Taiwan Literature and Transnational Cultural Studies at the General Education Center in all fields are not included in the graduation credits.

IV.Courses required by college curriculum:

Except for the courses listed below, all mandatory courses in Digital Humanities or EMI (English Medium Instruction) offered by the college or jointly offered may be credited as required professional credits for the respective department.

VI.Minimum of professional elective credits: 86 credits

A minimum of 86 credits must be taken (including credits from other departments).

Program electives: A minimum of 24 credits from the 'Taiwanese Humanities Core' group, and 20 credits each from the 'Intercultural' and 'Cultural Innovation' groups.

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VII. Other Regulations:

A maximum of 20 credits from other departments may be recognized (excluding courses jointly offered with this program), which can be applied toward the program-specific elective credits.

- VIII. Minor: Credits earned for a minor must be taken in addition to the minimum graduation credits required by the student's major (at least 20 credits). For further details, please refer to the announcements from the Academic Affairs Office, Course Management Section.
- **IX. Double Major:** Students from other departments pursuing a double major must complete the program's graduation requirements (including both college and program-specific required credits), with a minimum of 24 credits from the 'Taiwanese Humanities Core' group and 20 credits each from the 'Intercultural' and 'Cultural Innovation' groups.
- X. Cross-Disciplinary Expertise Development Program: For students whose compulsory courses and credits are the same as the ones offered by the departments (degree programs), double major, minor, or other cross-disciplinary expertise programs providing cross-disciplinary expertise courses, they shall take other elective courses that are related to their expertise and designated by the departments (degree programs) or colleges providing cross-disciplinary expertise module courses.
- XI. Students who graduate from the study period of the senior high school less than 6 years will be required to take at least 12 extra credits in their graduation requirements.

 The additional credits and courses must be selected from the courses offered by the College of Liberal Arts, with a maximum of 12 credits.
